TOURISM BUISNESS PROGRAMME

Topic: Use of geographical information systems (GIS) for the delivery of tourism resources

Aim - To introduce students to the use of geographic information systems (GIS) for the delivery of tourism resources. During the training, students will create a static maps of tourist routes in arcGIS Pro programme and prepare the presentation of routes in arcGIS online StoryMap application format.

Dates: 20 April (online) and 2-6 May (physical)

Total number of participants from partner institutions: 20 (10 from LV, 10 from PL)

Credits: The successful attendance awards 3 ECTS, students will receive the certificate

Participants: Bachelor level students are welcome to join the programme.

Working language: English

KVK will provide: all activities related to the programme, free accommodation in the studio apartments, free lunch.

Accommodation: Students will be accommodated in our partner's studio apartments, located in city centre. Rooms are double and triple, each room has a shower, toilet, mini kitchen, towels are provided (<https://kubu.lt/klaipeda/loft-studia/>).

Deadline: Nomination should be sent by email till 31 March, Learning Agreement for studies should be sent by email till 8 April.

Financial support: Students from partner institutions are eligible to receive a daily allowance supported by the Erasmus programme and granted by the sending institution.

Accompanying staff: Teaching staff from partner institutions can also participate in this project as an Erasmus lecturer/coach/guest speaker. Staff should receive funding from the sending university, which should cover mobility expenses, such as travel, accommodation, food.

Before arrival, students must be prepared material for their individual projects.

For students from Latvia. 10 students should choose from five border regions, 5 students should collect information on natural tourism resources in the neighbouring regions of Latvia-Lithuania, and another 5 on cultural tourism resources in the same neighbouring regions:

- Klaipėda county + Liepāja county
- Telšiai county + Kuldiga & Saldus county
- Šiauliai county + Dobeles & Jelgava county
- Panevėžys county + Bauska & Aizkraukle county
- Utena County + Jekabpils & Daugavpils county

For students from Poland. 5 students should collect information on natural tourism resources, and another 5 on cultural tourism resources in listed regions:

- Lubelskie county + Volyn county

- Podlaskie county + Brest County
- Podlaskie county + Hrodna county
- Alytus county + Podlaskie county
- Marijampolė county + Warminsko-Mazurskie county

Students need to collect information about resources they have been chosen:

- Good quality photos with references.
- Description of resources with references. The description should be about 50 words.
